Galileo built his telescope in the summer of 1609 On 25 August 1609, Galileo demonstrated his first telescope to Venetian lawmakers This was the first astronomical outreach activity with a telescope, and the first thoroughly documented use of the telescope for astronomy at Galilean Telescope
