In terms of health risk behaviour, negative health indices/health risk behaviour [22] such as substance use [23], bullying [19], health complaints [23], passive transportation [17], sedentary behaviour [17], not attending physical education classes [24,25], and inadequate fruit and vegetable consumption [26] were found to be associated with

Protecting school children from the serious threat of non ...

consumption among adolescents as compared to other countries over half the students Additionally regularly consumed unhealthy food (carbonated sugary drinks and fast food) while only a third regularly consume fruits and vegetables Thai adolescents have limited physical activity with only 20% of students
