The Power of Voodoo

At the heart of Voodoo is the lakou, a sort of family group that mixes natural and social forces and honors ancestors and lineages In their worship, the lakou use a type of rattle called an asson, which is viewed as representing apprenticeship and the idea of creating unity while still respecting people for their differences (Dominique, 103)
